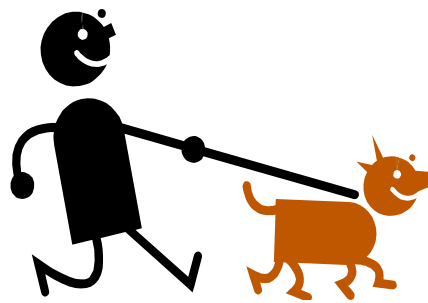

At school we are always seeking ways to further enrich our curriculum and provide our children with exciting and memorable learning experiences.

As part of our History work we regularly study and visit the village, Richmond town and explore further afield with topics on the Vikings, Tudors, Ancient Greeks and Egyptians, 2nd World War and the Victorians.

We have strong local links with Kiplin Hall and were delighted to be able to support their recent successful bid for Heritage Lottery Funding to explore the archaeology of Kiplin Hall Estate. As part of this project all the children will work with the resident archaeologist and be involved in a real archaeological dig at the beginning of June.

It is hoped that the area will yield some exciting discoveries; Mesolithic, some 12,000 years ago and Roman remains; possibly artefacts from the early 17th century gardens of Kiplin Hall. We will keep you posted!

39% hike in online debt help after Christmas



More and more people were fretting about their debts after Christmas this year, compared to 2012's festivities.

Citizens Advice had a 39% increase in the number of people seeking online help with debt problems between 26 December 2013 and 2 January 2014, compared to the same time in 2012. Over 23,800 people turned to adviceguide.org.uk to for help with their finances during that period.

The rising cost of energy, food and housing is putting extra pressure on people's finances. More than 1.4 million people sought online debt and budgeting help in 2013.

Carol Shreeve, bureau manager at Hambleton and Richmondshire CAB said: "Some budgets are at breaking point with January the time when people take stock of their finances. People who have never experienced money worries before are finding their finances increasingly tight as rises in day to day spending like keeping their home warm, getting to work and putting food on the table is sending them over the edge.

"Payday loans, credit cards and overdrafts are being used to top up people's income as wages are static. There are things people can do to get on top of their finances, including making sure they're getting all of the help available, aren't paying over the odds for things like gas and electricity and prioritising their spending to make sure there is money for essentials like rent, energy bills and water. Its important people don't wait for debts to mount before they seek help. A few early actions could stave off a future financial meltdown."
