After 12 years on Northallerton High Street Hambleton and Richmondshire Carers Centre has moved. The charitable organisation has relocated to larger, newer premises that are better suited for meeting the needs of carers. The new address is 2 Omega Business Village (off Thurston Road) DL6 2NJ. However, as has always been the case, support workers are more than happy to meet with carers at home.

‘People who are looking after others do not always see themselves as carers’.

The small friendly team at the Carers Centre provide free and confidential support to those people who are caring for a friend or relative. They can help on a range of issues, from one off enquiries such as: how to apply for a Blue Badge, to more complex benefits advice and longer term emotional support for the carer. They support all carers from age 5 to 95 years of age, irrespective of where the person they are caring for lives.
