Scorton Feast

Adult recipe

Class 70: JUBILEE CAKE:

Recipe: Be-Ro Victoria Sponge. (Optional as a Plain or Chocolate Sponge)
175g (6oz) each of: S.R flour, Caster Sugar, unsalted Butter; 3 large Eggs (beaten); 1 Tbsp water.

Optional: if making Chocolate sponge replace 25g (1oz) of S.R. Flour with 25g (1oz) Cocoa Powder.

Method:

- 1) Preheat oven: Conventional 180C, Fan 160C, Gas 4
- 2) Grease and line 2 x 18cm (7 inch) sandwich tins with Baking Parchment.
- 3) Sift flour into a bowl and set aside.
- 4) Use electric whisk to cream together sugar and butter until light and fluffy.
- 5) Gradually add the beaten eggs and water with a little flour
- 6) Gently fold in remainder of the flour until all ingredients are combined.
- 7) Turn into and share between the two baking tins; level the surface.
- 8) Bake for 25-30 minutes until well-risen, golden and firm to the touch.
- 9) Allow to cool in the tins for 5 minutes, then turn out and cool fully on a wire rack.
- 10) Add filling of own choice
- 11) Add Union National Flag Topping.
- 12) Display.

Children's recipe Age 6+

Fairy Buns: Recipe and Method:

Recipe: (will make more than 4 Fairy Cakes)

110g (4oz) each of: Butter, Caster Sugar and Self Raising Flour

2 Eggs

Method:

- 1) Preheat oven: Conventional 180C, Fan 160C, Gas 4
- 2) Fill a 12 Cupcake/Fairy Bun baking tray with 12 Paper Cases
- 3) Sift flour into a bowl and set aside.
- 4) Use electric whisk to cream together sugar and butter until light and fluffy.
- 5) Gradually add the beaten eggs with a little flour
- 6) Gently fold in remainder of the flour until all ingredients are combined.
- 7) Half fill Paper Cases with the mixture
- 8) Bake for 15-20 minutes until well-risen, golden and firm to the touch.
- 9) Allow to cool in the baking tray for 5 minutes, then lift out Paper Cases and cool fully on a wire rack.
- 10) Choose the best 4 Fairy Buns!
- 11) Decorate using your own ideas and choice of decorations
- 12) Display.

Cemetery regulations

Over the years, since the Scorton and District Cemetery was created, there have been many small regulatory changes. However, this year safety regulations have been implemented and we need the support and help of the parish with these. The Cemetery Committee is now obliged to check all grave stones both upright and flat to confirm they are safe. This must be done by a certified official and a report given to us. We are going to use RDC but as you would expect this will have a cost implication. This check also includes items left on graves that could harm or injure people especially small children. For this our first check the Cemetery Committee has decided to pay for any repair's maintenance needed and as some of you have seen we have had several gravestones laid down recently.

At subsequent checks, we will contact the next of kin to ask them to do the maintenance. If this is not completed within 6 months, the committee will be obliged to make the grave safe. Usually by keeping the gravestone lying flat or removing any dangerous parts.

May I ask anyone who has a loved one in our cemetery to check that they are happy articles left on the grave are not going to be a hazard to anyone.

Should anyone wish to discuss this, or any other cemetery matters please contact the Clerk or myself.
